1.0 Policy Statement

This is a statement of the Irish Lung Fibrosis Association's (ILFA) policy for Cookies collected via the website, www.ilfa.ie

2.0 Aim of Policy

The Irish Lung Fibrosis Association (ILFA) respects the privacy of all visitors to our website (www.ilfa.ie) and social media (www.facebook.com/ILFAIreland, www.twitter.com/ILFAIreland) . This Cookie Policy outlines our policy concerning the use of cookies and similar technologies.

3.0 Scope of Policy

This document provides guidelines on how cookies are collected via ILFA's website. ILFA may update our Cookie Policy from time to time to reflect changes in technology or legislation, or our data use policies which may affect the way in which cookies and similar technologies are used by us and how you as a user, can manage them.

This Cookie Policy forms part of ILFA's overall Privacy Statement.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files placed and stored in your computer, tablet, mobile or other device. These technologies may collect your device identifier (IDFA), computer IP address, device location or other information from your device. This can also be used to recognise when your device visits pages on our website. Cookies allow a website 'remember' your actions or preferences over a length of time.

Performance related cookies

These cookies are used to collect statistical information about visitors to our website and the pages viewed. These cookies don't collect information that identifies a visitor by name. We use these cookies to understand what content is popular, which helps us to improve our website. All information collected by these cookies is used on a depersonalised basis.

Other third-party cookies

Some cookies that have been set on our websites are not related to ILFA. For example, when you visit a page with content embedded from other service provider companies including YouTube, Facebook or social media etc., these service providers may use their own cookies.

ILFA does not control the use of third-party cookies and cannot access them. Third-party cookies can only be accessed by the original party who set them. You should check the third-party websites for more information about these cookies.

Your choices for managing cookies

Your device or browser may enable you to choose whether you wish to accept cookies or not and thus control the collection of data from your device (please see your device and browser instructions for more information).

Generally, your browser will offer you the choice to accept, refuse or delete cookies at all times, or those from providers that website owners use ('third-party cookies'), or those from specific websites.

Please note that if you choose to turn off cookies, you may lose some features and / or functionality of the ILFA website.
